Child Friendly Online Safety Policy

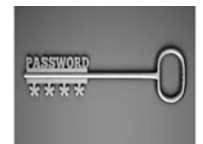
Our Online Safety Rules
These rules help us to stay safe online:

- Keep things to myself.
- Be nasty or unkind back.
- Delete messages.
- Get angry or upset.

- Be kind to other online.
- Keep our personal information private.
- Always ask if you are unsure or tell an adult if you feel unsafe.
- Do not talk to strangers online.
- Only use the Internet when adults are in the room with you.
- Keep our passwords secret.
